He follows her to the cabaret and realizes that she is the beautiful dancer “Mademoiselle Margot,” but also the love interest of the local gangster Yashka. With its jazzy score by Dmitri Shostakovich and its music-hall atmosphere featuring beautiful tangos, *The Golden Age* is a refreshing and colorful dive into the roaring 20’s. A historic ballet that can be seen only at the Bolshoi. Runtime: 2 hours, 20 minutes.

Set in Victorian London, the bitter tale is told of the predatory outlaw Macheath, known as "Mack the Knife." He secretly marries the daughter of Soho's underworld boss, but is soon betrayed by his sinister in-laws and sent to prison. After being freed by the police chief's daughter, he is again betrayed- this time by a prostitute-and sentenced to death. Queen Victoria herself makes an appearance, thus providing a menacing finale of ferocious irony.
