## March 2018 Outings

### **Saturday 3/3: Fayetteville Manlius High School musical; *Cinderella***

Rodgers and Hammerstein's Broadway version of the fairytale classic. Everyone knows the story of the girl named Ella and her stepmother and stepsisters who treat her poorly. With the help of her fairy godmother, Ella is able to meet the Prince at the ball and finds her happily ever after. The musical features songs such as "In My Own Little Corner", "Impossible", "A Lovely Night", & "There is Music in You."

Moscow-born pianist Natasha Paremski performs Prokofiev's Piano Concerto No. 2 on this all-Russian concert. The program concludes with Stravinsky's controversial redefinition of 20th Century music, Rite of Spring.

### **Sunday 3/4: Bolshoi Ballet at Shoppingtown; *The Flames of Paris***

In the era of the French Revolution, Jeanne and her brother Jérôme leave Marseille for Paris in support of the revolutionary effort that is taking over the capital. While fighting for freedom, they both encounter love along the way. Very few ballets can properly depict the Bolshoi's overflowing energy and fiery passion as can Alexei Ratmansky's captivating revival of Vasily Vainonen's *The Flames of Paris*. Runtime is 2 hours 15 minutes.

**Sunday 3/4: Syracuse Stage; *A Raisin in the Sun***

Lorraine Hansberry's masterwork has rightfully earned its place among the great American plays because it speaks anew to each generation. The story of the Younger family—three generations trying to build a better life on Chicago's South Side—resonates loudly with those pursuing the American dream today. Whose dreams get realized and whose deferred?
