Friday 9/6: The Seward House Museum with lunch in Auburn

The Seward House Museum, the historic home of William Henry Seward and his family. Serving as a New York State Senator, Governor of New York, a U.S. Senator, and as Secretary of State in the Lincoln and Johnson administrations, Seward was one of the foremost politicians of nineteenth century America. After our guided tour, we will have lunch at Kosta's Bar & Grill.

Saturday 9/21: Symphoria Masterworks; All Brahms

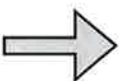

Sunday 9/22: Redhouse Theater; RENT

Based loosely on Puccini's *La Boheme*, Jonathan Larson's *Rent* follows a year in the life of a group of impoverished young artists and musicians struggling to survive and create in New York's Lower East Side, under the shadow of HIV/AIDS. The physical and emotional complications of the disease pervade the lives of Roger, Mimi, Tom and Angel. How these young bohemians negotiate their dreams, loves and conflicts provides the narrative thread to this groundbreaking musical.

Tuesday 9/24: Gifford Author Series at The Civic Center; Jesmyn Ward

MacArthur Genius and two-time National Book Award winner Jesmyn Ward has been hailed as the standout writer of her generation, proving her “fearless and toughly lyrical” voice in novels, memoir, and nonfiction. Her novel *Sing, Unburied, Sing* one of the 10 Best Books of 2017 by *The New York Times* and *The Washington Post* called it one of the year’s best books. Betsy Burton of the American Booksellers Association has called her “the new Toni Morrison.” In 2017, she became the first woman and the first person of color to win two National Book Awards for Fiction—joining the ranks of William Faulkner, Saul Bellow, John Cheever, Philip Roth, and John Updike.
